#### What's New

It's Guided Program season, which means solving paleontological mysteries in the Dinosaur Hall, collecting insect samples in the garden, and developing scientific questions in the mammal halls with your students. Our Guided Programs are free 45-minute hands-on activities with a Museum educator, but they only run through the end of January, so make sure to submit that request soon. Dinosaur Encounters, our popular live performance for 1st-5th grade, now runs every Thursday year-round. Make a reservation with our call center to meet historical characters and life-sized dinosaurs face-to-face!

While this year we've implemented a new policy limiting schools to a 1:5 adult-to-student ratio\*, we've also created a new combination ticket that allows additional adults to purchase \$12 daily admission to both the Natural History Museum and the Page Museum at the La Brea Tar Pits. 
