The First Day of Camp

Please bring the following with you on the first day of class:

- **Forms** All forms (including the Waiver and Conduct form) for the first day of camp can be found here: http://www.nhm.org/site/activities-programs/adventures-in-nature/confirmation-materials
- **Waiver** Each participant must have a waiver form signed by their parent or legal guardian in order to participate.
- Conduct Each child must have a conduct form signed in order to participate.
 Lunch and Water Bottle- Please provide your camper with a lunch and water bottle each day.
 Reusable water bottles are encouraged!

Directions/Parking Information

- The La Brea Tar Pits & Museum is located at 5801 Wilshire Boulevard on Museum Row in Los Angeles, CA 90036.
- If you will be visiting the museum while your child is in class, you can park in the Museum Parking Lot on Curson. Currently, parking costs \$15.00 for the whole day. http://www.tarpits.org/
- 15 Minute Parking If you won't be visiting the museum while your child is in class, you may park for up to 15 minutes in the Museum parking lot while you sign your child in at the registration area.
 To facilitate free access to this lot, please place the 15 minute parking slip on your dashboard. Cars left in the temporary parking spaces for more than 15 minutes are subject to towing. Sign In/Out Policy

- <u>Children must be signed in and out of class by a parent or guardian every day</u>. For the safety of your child, curbside drop-offs cannot be allowed; DO NOT drop off your child, then park, then sign in.
- Advance written notice is required if someone other than who is on your emergency list will pick up your child. Please bring a signed note and remind whoever is picking up your child that they must bring picture ID to sign out your child.

Registration

Registration tables will be located outside the museum's north entrance near the parking lot. Classes will begin and end on time. Please be prompt in dropping your child off by 9 a.m. and picking up your child at 3 p.m. The museum has neither facilities nor staff available to supervise children before or after class.

Pick-Up Late Charges

Please pick up your child promptly at the end of class. There will be a 10 minute grace period, after which a \$1 per MINUTE late fee will be assessed.

Participants Grade Level

To ensure the best possible experience for all, your child must be entering the appropriate grade level selected by September 30, 2019. Otherwise, they will be unable to participate and a refund or credit will not be given.

Lunch and Snacks

- Children will be supervised by Education Division staff members during lunch time (11:30 AM 12:30 PM).
- All children <u>must</u> bring a packed lunch, a drink, and enough snacks for two snack breaks. The
 Museum does not have a cafeteria and vending machines will not be accessible to students during
 the lunch break.

What NOT to bring to camp:

- Fidget spinners, Tablets, electronic games, trading cards, roller-skate shoes, MP3 Players, money, cell phones.
- <u>DO</u> wear sturdy shoes that you use to play outside, (no flip-flops please).

Medication/Special Needs

The Museum's policy is to <u>not</u> dispense medication to children. If your child has special medical or other needs, the situation will be considered on a case-by-case basis. Please call (213) 763-3433 to discuss.

Cancellations

Cancellations made 2 weeks prior to camp start date will receive a 100% refund. No refund will be given to cancellations made after this period.

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Mission Statement and Conduct Policy

Please review with your child and bring on the first day of class

Our mission is to provide your child with the opportunity to explore fascinating topics through active encounters that spark his/her natural curiosity. We believe having an enjoyable learning experience ranks just as highly as the information that is learned.

To ensure that <u>everyone</u> participating in our program has a fun and safe experience, we expect all participants to be respectful of the rights and property of others, so we have set the following conduct policy:

- Our instructors and staff will go over the Adventures in Nature rules on the first day of class and during the lunch period.
 They are: Be Smart (think before you act, pick-up after yourself), Be Safe (Stay with the group) and Be Nice (use kind words, keep hands to self, etc.)
- 2. If our staff observes a participant engaging in inappropriate behavior, we will coach him/her about the situation. Examples of inappropriate behavior include, but are not limited to fighting (verbal or physical), stealing, property damage, harassment or name-calling, disrupting the class, being disrespectful etc. The instructor or the program coordinator will inform the caregiver about the situation.
- 3. If the behavior continues after coaching, the participant may receive an in-class time-out and it will be discussed with the caregiver.
- 4. If the behavior still continues, the participants will meet formally with the program coordinator to discuss his/her behavior and the participant's parent/guardian will be advised.
- 5. If the behavior continues after formally meeting with the program coordinator, the participant will be excused from the program and the parent/guardian contacted to pick him/her up. If the participant is excused before the program has ended, there will be no refund.

This policy is designed to protect your child's right to a positive and productive learning environment, which you have paid for and have a right to expect. We thank you for your assistance in ensuring everyone at Adventures in Nature has an outstanding experience.
