Exhibition Space	Floor, Description	Sound Rating	Light Rating	Touch Rating
Grand Foyer	Level 1 This is the Museum's main entryway. See the Dueling Dinosaurs and keep your eye out for volunteers with touchable specimens. When busy, this space can be loud.	нідн	MODERATE	LOW
Dinosaur Hall	Level 1 Our most popular hall, with a lot to see! This space is well lit, often busy, and can get quite noisy. This hall has some opportunity for interaction in both touching fossil casts and touch screens.	HIGH	HIGH	MODERATE
Age of Mammals	Level 1 This two-level exhibition has bright natural light with spaces to sit down throughout, and an elevator and stairs to provide access to the Mezzanine level. Look for interactive touch screens on both levels.	MODERATE	MODERATE	LOW
Becoming Los Angeles	Level 1 This large exhibition tells the history of Los Angeles. Video screens as well as the open nature of the exhibition can cause echoing. Opportunities to sit down exist throughout the exhibition.	MODERATE	MODERATE	LOW
North American/African Mammal Halls	Level 1/Level 2 These halls feature intricate diorama scenes with taxidermied animals. These low-light exhibitions are popular among school visitors and tend to echo. Look for volunteers with touchable specimens near entrances!	MODERATE	LOW	LOW
Gem and Mineral Hall	Level 1 This very low-light exhibition is carpeted, which reduces noise some, but still gets noisy on busier days. There are a few opportunities to touch mineral specimens.	MODERATE	LOW	LOW
Discovery Center	Level 2 This space is very interactive! It includes an insect zoo, fossil dig pits, and many touchable elements. It is heavily visited and can get loud on some days. The hall is a bright, open space that has an elevator to the first floor.	HIGH	HIGH	HIGH





Dinosaur Encounters	Level 2 This live theater performance features a life-size full-suit dinosaur puppet. It takes place on a stage in the North American Mammal Hall, Level 2. The show uses bright stage lights. The performers are using a microphone and it can be very noisy in the hall. You are seated on the floor sometimes very close to other people or on a wooden bench.	нісн	MODERATE	MODERATE
Sensory-Friendly Dinosaur Encounters	Level 2 This live theater performance is similar to our Dinosaur Encounters above, but tailored to be more sensory-friendly. There are a variety of seating options including mats and bean bags, the show lighting is softer and the room itself is warmly lit. The microphones are only mildly amplified. There are areas in the back of the room away from the performance with comfortable pillows.	MODERATE	LOW	LOW
Bird Hall	Level 2 Portions of the Hall of Birds are currently closed, but 400 taxi- dermied local bird species are still on display in this medium lit space. Visit our website for more up-to-date information.	LOW	MODERATE	LOW
Visible Vault	Level 2 This space is a wide hallway with Meso-American artifacts displayed in glass cases on either side. There are two touch- activated screens, which highlight objects. There is very low light in this section and hard surfaces can create an echo.	LOW	LOW	LOW
Dino Lab	Level 2 This space is a long, wide hallway with a glass window that allows guests to see fossil preparators at work cleaning fossils from the collection. This space is bright.	MODERATE	MODERATE	LOW
Nature Lab	Level G The Nature Lab is a large space with interactive elements. It has live animal displays. The space is very bright and can be noisier on busier days.	HIGH	HIGH	HIGH





The Story of P-22	Level G This temporary exhibition features the story of mountain lion P-22. It is a bright space with many interactive and touchable elements. There is a projection on the floor guests can step on.	MODERATE	MODERATE	нібн
Becoming Jane (Nov 7–Apr 17, 2022)	Level G Our newest temporary exhibit is immersive and relatively interactive, with lots of touchable elements. The light throughout is very low and there is a good deal of ambient noise that can be heard carrying from other parts of the exhibit, making it a noisy space throughout.	HIGH	LOW	MODERATE
Museum Cafe	Level G/Outside On busy days the Café will be bustling during the lunch hours (from around 11:30 – 2:00). Seek seating on the patio or in the indoor hallway outside the Café entrance for a quieter place to enjoy food. Food orders can also be taken to-go and eaten elsewhere.	MODERATE	нідн	LOW
Nature Gardens	Outside The Nature Gardens is a large outdoor space that surrounds the Museum. It has a water feature, pond, additional seating areas, areas of bright sun and shade. Guests are encouraged to touch and smell the plants but not to pick them. Guests will also see some wildlife living in the gardens.	MODERATE	нідн	HIGH
Butterfly/Spider Pavilion	Outside The Pavilion is an enclosed outdoor space that features our seasonal Butterfly Pavilion (Spring-Fall) and Spider Pavilion (Fall). Guests can see the animals in their natural environment out- side enclosures. It is not temperature controlled, there is timed ticketing to enter and can be busy during peak times. Guests are encouraged to look but not touch the live animals in this space.	HIGH	HIGH	LOW


