Abstract:

Scope and Content:

An artificial collection includes textual and non-textual materials of American politics. Textual holdings consist of election and political ephemera: stickers, bumper stickers, campaign cards, handbills, leaflets, pamphlets, broadsides, newspapers, serial publications, ballots, ticket stubs, electoral tickets and voting guides. There are ephemera for presidential inaugurations, including programs and tickets. Other items are commemorative books, drafts of the Los Angeles City Charter; a 1927 supplement to the Political Code of California and national convention guides. Non-textual material includes posters, a few postcards, and two sound recordings. Other artifacts are buttons, ribbons and leather-bound and woven keepsakes. There are a few foreign items.

Chronologically, the collection runs from 1828 to 2004 (with the most recent items represented by “bumper stickers” contained in Box 3. The bulk dates cover the 20th century, although there are significant 19th century materials and a few 21st century items. The earliest item dates to 1828 (a House of Representatives document entitled “Memorial of the Central Committee of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Convention” in folder 34); an 1849 item (in California. Election. Governor folder 25); and an 1856 item (State Elections folder 30.) There are approximately three items in German (California Elections folder 24.) There are items in Italian found among the 19th century materials.

The collection had many contributors. The oldest materials of the 19th century derive from the Historical Society of Southern California (A.30). Owen Coy, a past USC professor, donated many of the 20th century ephemeral materials. Other contributors include D. L. McGurk (A.9914), P.921.73, P.908.73, A.515, A.11458, A.11434.2000, Howard H. Griffen (A.9685), A.9028, A.9888.74-49, A.4726.200, A.10643.2002, Bob Wade (A.9985) and Sam Behrendt (A.4970).

Series and Arrangement Note:

The collection is arranged in three series: 1. Ephemera and Other Political Materials; 2. Newspaper and Magazine Clippings and Serial Publications; 3. Non-California and Foreign Political Materials, 20th Century.

Series 1 is the heart of the collection and has three subseries. Subseries 1.1 is the largest subseries and is divided into three areas: United States politics, California politics and Los

Angeles politics. Within each area, materials are arranged chronologically by topic. Box 2 and 2A are the exceptions, because consolidated here are 19th century materials of all political spheres, including other state and local municipal elections.

Box 1ov and map case items are arranged by size rather than topic.

Series 2 has two subseries. Subseries 2.1 contains clippings in chronological order. Subseries 2.2 consists of publications arranged alphabetically within the following political spheres: United States, California, and Los Angeles. This subseries has a heavy emphasis in local newspapers and serial publications that were election propaganda during the 1930s and 1940s.

Series 3 contains other regional materials, including foreign materials, for the 20th century. Since the bulk of GC 1137 reflects local politics and local political activities towards California and federal issues and candidates, Series 3 houses materials that are non-California, foreign, and other regions. (For 19th century materials, see Box 2.)
