- MSS-1 through MSS-524 were originally organized and entered as bibliographic records in OCLC. The following numbered files are not found, possibly due to mis-numbering: MSS-18, MSS-36, MSS-38, MSS-162, MSS-223, MSS-360, MSS-361, MSS-444, MSS-445, MSS-458, MSS-525, and MSS-526. Additional items have been added to the collection, however, these items do not have bibliographic records in OCLC. The additional items begin with MSS-527 and include oversize items (i.e. MSS-1ov, MSS-2ov, etc.).

While defeat by the superior forces of the Americans was inevitable, General Castro vowed never to submit, and proclaimed his unflinching loyalty to the government. Castro denounced the United States forces, praised the patriotic Californians who remained loyal to Mexico, and urged his fellow countrymen to continue to resist the foreign invaders: "Long live the Mexican Republic!
