
The Blk Craftsroom

She also works with Self Help Graphics & Art to bridge more opportunities for art education across Los Angeles.

Las Chicas Peligrosas



Shop bold illustrations and prints from Jackie Hernandez (They/She), a first-generation, queer Latinx artist based in Los Angeles. Also known as Las Chicas Peligrosas, the artist transforms stories into visually compelling illustrations that represent diverse cultures, neighborhoods, and community members. She utilizes various art forms, including printmaking, murals, and digital illustration, to share her unique perspective.

Kalli Arte Collective




Discover original printmaking, gallery exhibitions, art installations, and unique designs from this family artists' collective based in Boyle Heights. Started by two self-taught artists, Adriana Carranza and Alfonso Aceves, and their four children, Kalli Arte is dedicated to speaking directly to their community and beyond through their originally designed and made artwork.

King Cre8



Explore incredible masterpieces from Eric "King Cre8" Walker, who has been producing artwork since the early 1980s. He uses aerosol paint, acrylics, markers, and more to create a visual impact at many levels through strokes, blends, splatters, and controlled lines of calculated precision. King Cre8 also provides creative support to those in need through art therapy, and his art has been exhibited at major institutions such as LACMA, MOCA, and the Getty Museum Research Institute.

Self Help Graphics & Art



Visit this institution, founded in 1970 in the heart of East Los Angeles, which is dedicated to the production, interpretation, and distribution of prints and other art media by Chicana/o and Latina/o artists. Their multidisciplinary and intergenerational programs promote artistic excellence and empower the community by providing access to space, tools, training, and capital.

World of Willkapedia



Immerse yourself in the unique universe of Willie Thomas, a self-taught artist hailing from Compton. His artwork, which often features a 2D animation style, celebrates Black identity, skin tones, queer culture, and women. Through his creations, including unique prints, original creations, stickers, and clay sculptures, Will aims to uplift communities that are frequently misrepresented in contemporary society and serve as a bridge across diasporas.
